



This month's focus: Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration (AVRR), to and from Egypt

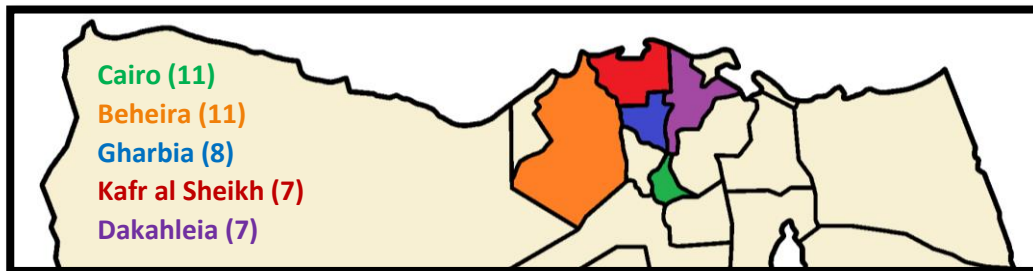
Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration (AVRR) **from** Egypt endeavours to provide sustainable options for migrants whose residence in Egypt is no longer viable or personally desirable. Essential to the provision of this service, is voluntariness; IOM will not participate in coercion to return and ensures full consent through one to one interviews with potential applicants

Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration (AVRR) **to** Egypt supports Egyptians stranded in Europe, and their subsequent socio-economic reintegration in Egypt. Most of the returnees choose to start-up their own businesses with the reintegration assistance provided (96.8% of returnees in 2016), improving both their own livelihood and that of their community

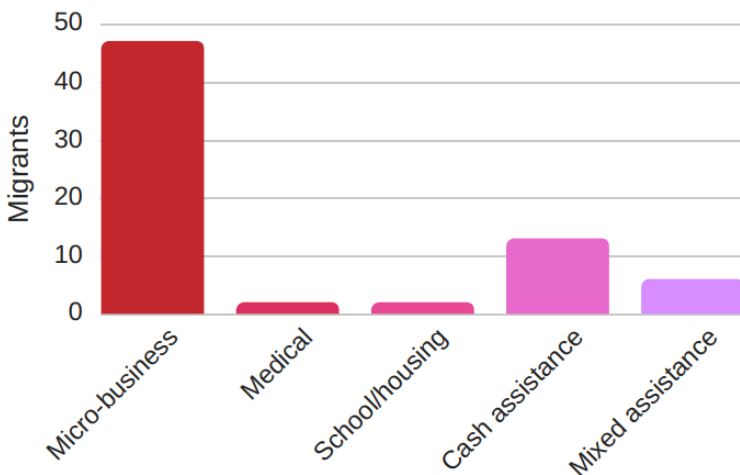
EGYPTIANS RECEIVED VOLUNTARY RETURN AND REINTEGRATION ASSISTANCE

Afiba left Nigeria and came to Egypt in 2012 for university. Throughout his studies he dreamt of going home to visit his family, but could never make it happen. After finishing his degree, he approached IOM to assist him to return home. Eligible for Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration, he returned to Nigeria in April 2017 and was provided with a reintegration grant.

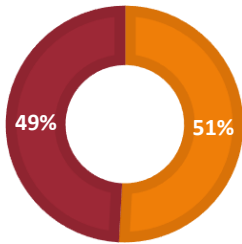
After returning, Afiba wanted to continue his studies and get a Master’s degree, so he decided to use the reintegration grant in a manner that would help to sustain himself and his family financially. He used the reintegration amount to pay for computer engineering training that will allow him to set up a small computer engineering shop.

Afiba is now exploring the opportunity to open the shop in Nigeria.

RETURNING MIGRANTS BY SEX

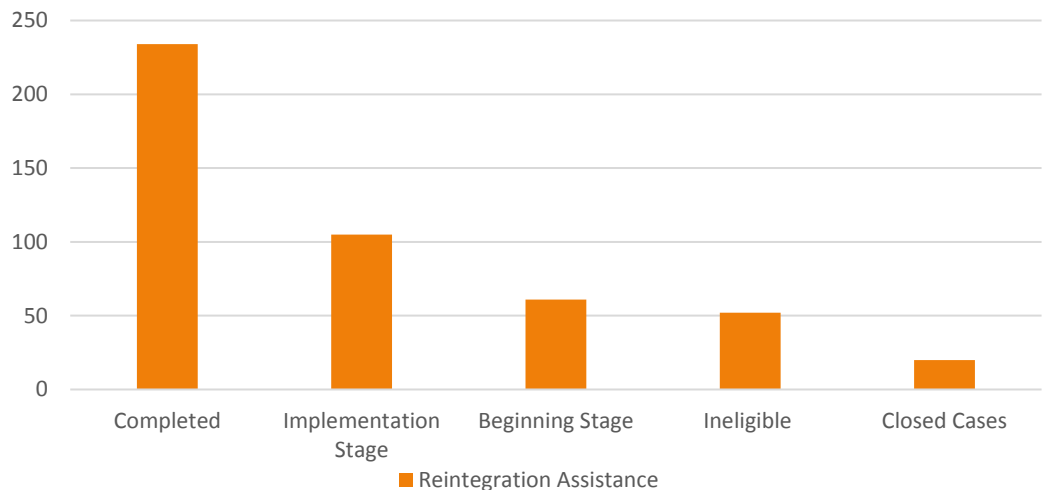
