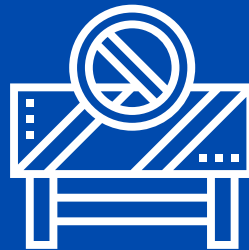
COVID-19 Pandemic

Challenges

The COVID-19 Pandemic has resulted in severe economic and social impacts around the world. IOM Egypt has been committed to supporting migrants who are hardest hit due to loss of income, discrimination, and stigma during this pandemic. According to the IOM study with the Ministry of Health and Population (MoHP) and other UN agencies*, migrants who perceived COVID-19 as a stigma is more than double the percentage of Egyptians. (53 percent and 23 percent)

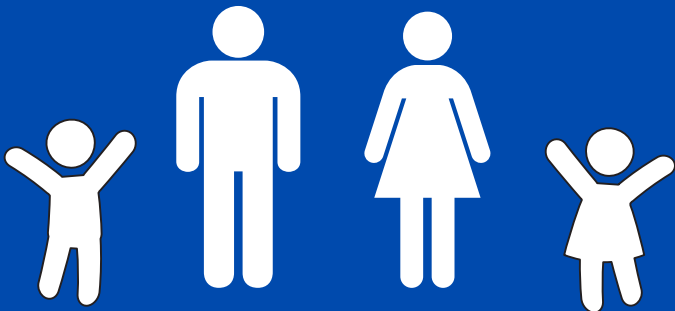

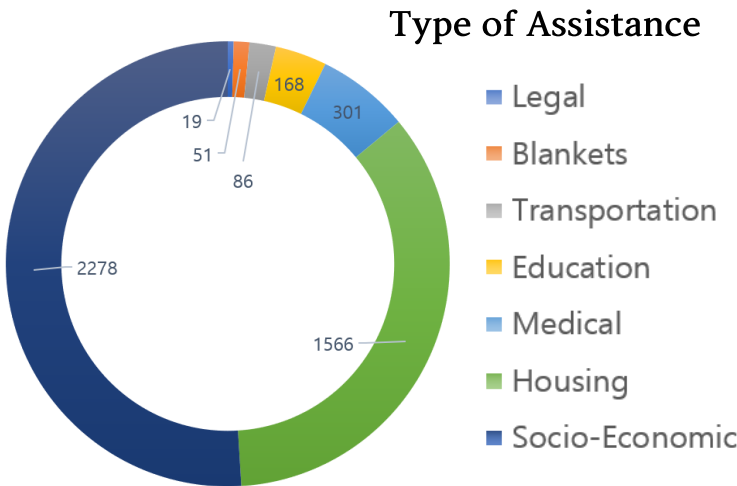

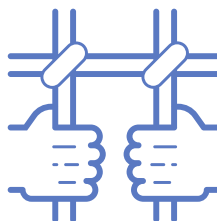

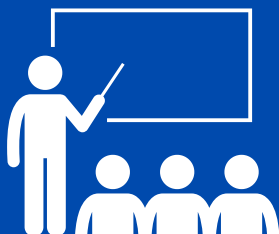

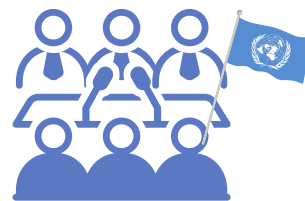

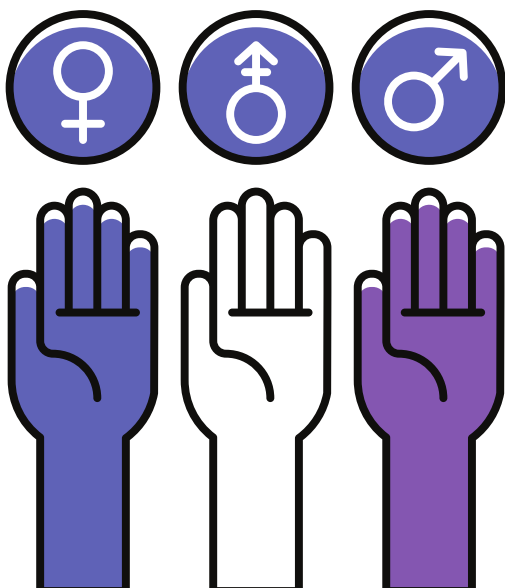
